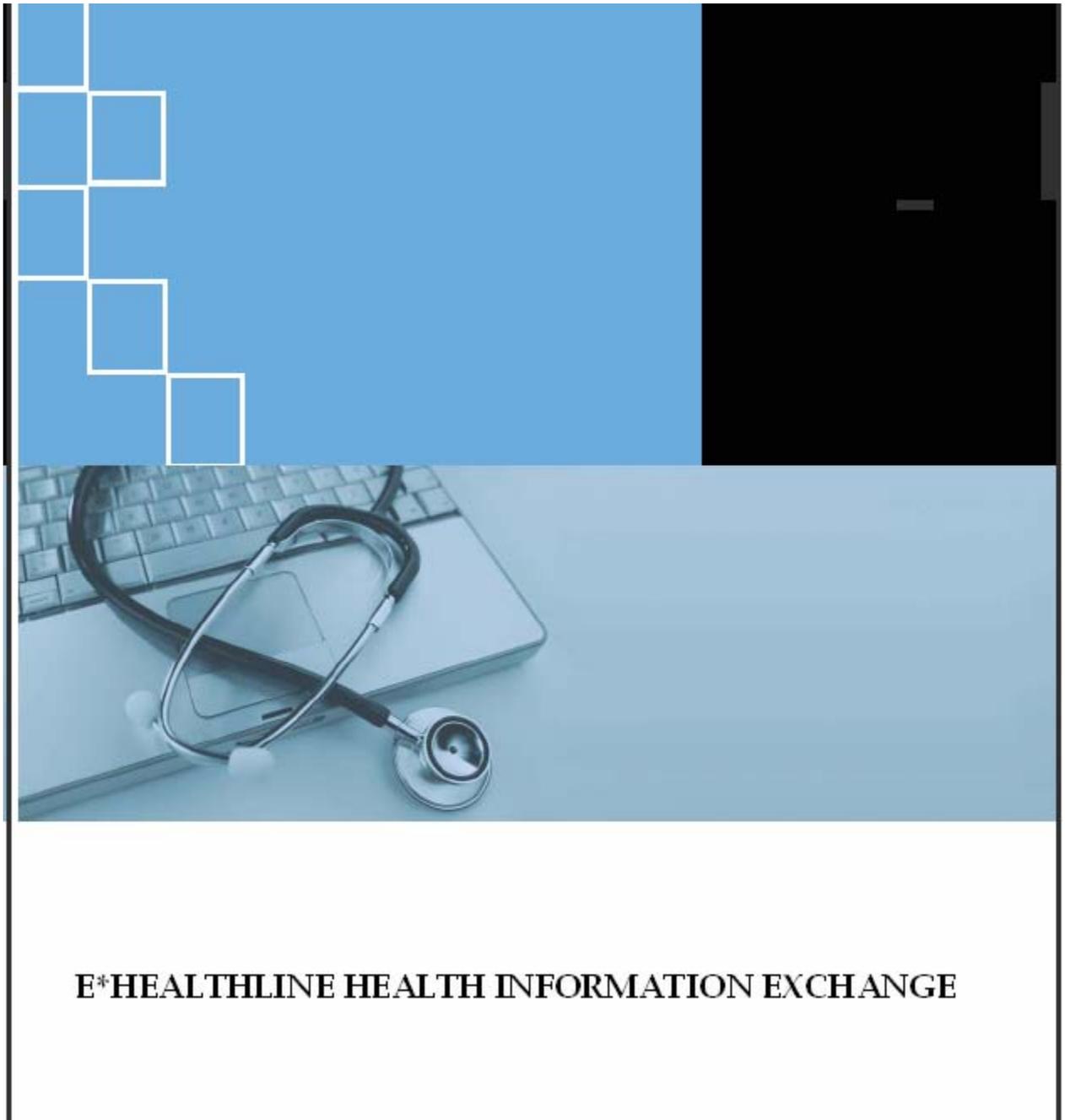

The Health Information Exchange gateway is configured to seamlessly integrate with the Healthcare Providers and Payers.

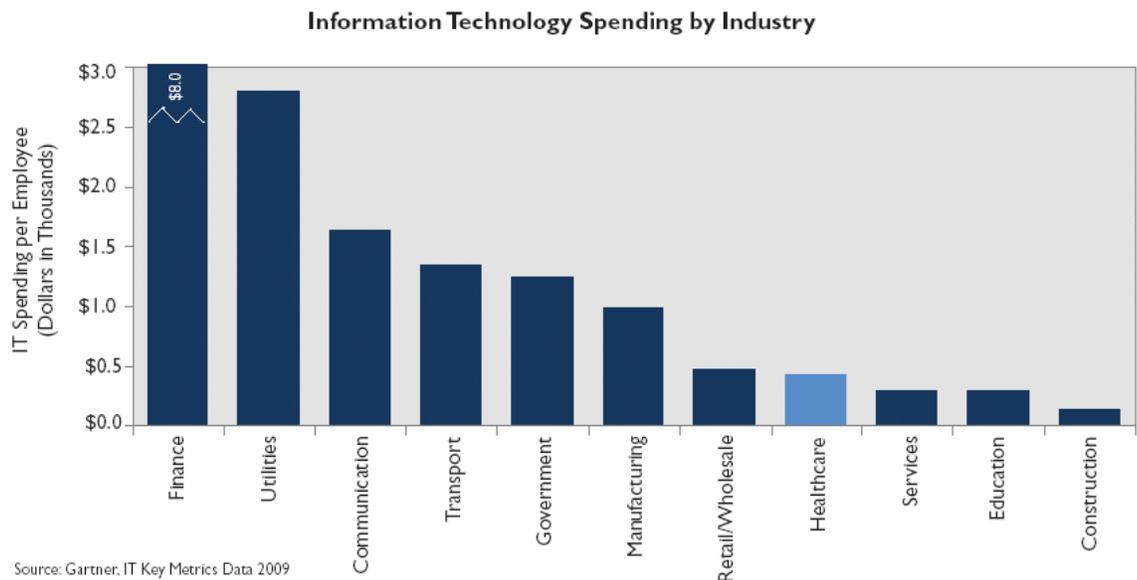

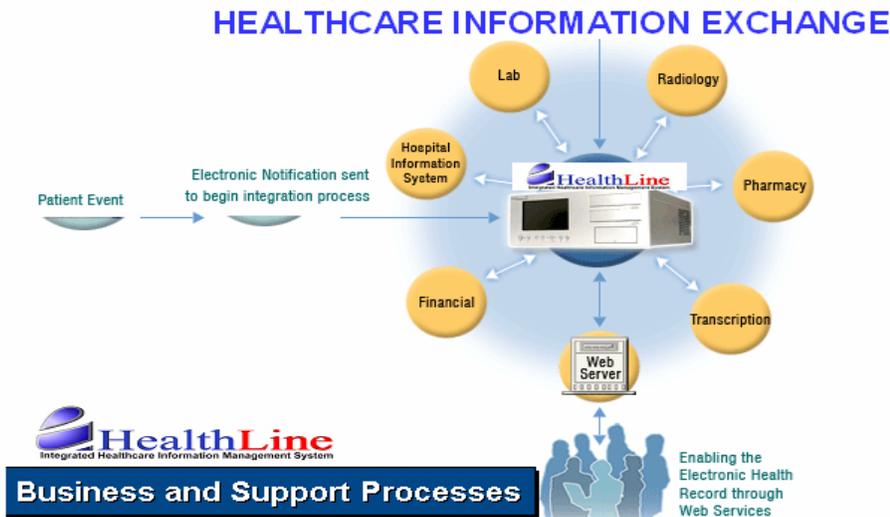
3. E*HealthLine Health Information Exchange (HIE) Network

Historically, the lack of a common technology standard has resulted in the implementation of highly customized, proprietary technology platforms that are difficult to integrate into homogeneous environments. Standards-based HIEs are being developed to share clinical and administrative information between various technology mediums. The proposed National Health Information Network (NHIN) will promote the coordinated use of established standards from organizations such as Digital Imaging and Communications in Medicine (DICOM) and Health Level Seven (HL7) for clinical and administrative data. Regional Health Information Organizations (RHIOs), driven by local and state level initiatives, are important drivers of a nationally recognized exchange.
